Connecting Educators Through Native Hawaiian Resources: Part 1

Mānoa Heritage Center (MHC) is collaborating with Awaialulu (a non-profit dedicated to developing resources and people that can bridge Hawaiian knowledge from the past to the present and the future), the University of Hawai'i, and the Hawai'i State Department of Education on a three-year project to support educators interested in designing inquiries that utilize local resources.

Participants in this course will be introduced to the College, Career, and Civic Life C3 Framework for Social Studies State Standards (C3 Framework) and use the Inquiry Design Model (IDM) to create standards-based classroom inquiries that utilize place-based resources. Social Studies teachers and English Language Arts teachers who are looking to deepen students' content knowledge through place-based informational text will especially benefit from participation in this course. This course is part one of a three-part series of professional development that will take place over three years, generously funded by the National Endowment for the Humanities (NEH).

Participants will be able to:

- 1. Describe the Inquiry Arc of the College, Career and Civic Life (C3) Framework for Social Studies State Standards, the three major shifts in the Common Core State Standards for English Language Arts, and the role of Nā Hopena A'o in place-based education.
- 2. Apply the Inquiry Design Model (IDM) to create inquiries with compelling questions, supporting questions, formative and summative performance tasks, resources and informed action.
- 3. Identify place-based resources for teaching inquiry
